Dear Family in Christ,

Eight youth will be confirmed on Pentecost Day, Sunday, June 4<sup>th</sup>! We thank God that they have been baptized, catechized (big New Testament word for “taught the Christian faith”), and will confess their faith publicly before our congregation. Please do your part by supporting them with your attendance on that day and keep them in your prayers that they may remain steadfast in Christ’s Word and faith until the end.

The faith that is given to them and to us is a free gift from God (Ephesians 2:8-9). And, as our Lutheran Confessions say, “So that we may obtain this faith, the ministry of teaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments was instituted” (Augsburg Confession V). We need pastors to bring us the Gospel!

It came to my attention that the number of seminary students available for calls this year was significantly lower than the number of congregations seeking pastors. The Rev. Prof. Jeffrey Pulse, who is responsible for the placement of candidates, told me that he felt bad that so many of the congregations would not be receiving pastors.

When Jesus sent out 72 disciples to proclaim that the kingdom of God has come near, He told them to pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest (Luke 10). Things have not changed! We should pray to God that He send out more pastors to preach and administer the sacraments.

In this year’s small class of seminary students from Fort Wayne was a former student from College Hill! Some of you remember Thomas “TJ” Cowell. He and his wife, Hannah (Miesner) Cowell, were students here just a few years ago. He received a call to Burt and Algona, Iowa (funny how that sounds like a married couple “Burt and Algona”! J) His ordination and installation will be on Sunday, June 25<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 p.m. at St. John’s Lutheran Church in Burt, Iowa.

We have been blessed at College Hill Lutheran Church to have had faithful pastors serve over the course of 75 years. Although he never was called to this congregation, the Rev. Thomas C. Wegener has served as vacancy pastor twice. Once after the retirement of Rev. Edgar Brammer and more recently after the Rev. Thomas Ogilvie accepted another call in 2006. I hope you will be able to recognize his service to this congregation as he celebrates the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his ordination which will take place on Sunday, July 9<sup>th</sup>. The Rev. Dr. Brian Saunders will be the guest preacher and presiding minister over The Rite of Anniversary of an Ordination. As we may have several guests with us that day, we plan to have a potluck lunch at 11:30 a.m. The Wegener family will provide lasagna. Congregation members are asked to bring a dish or two to share. A reception and program will follow at 1 p.m.

The Lord of the harvest bless all of you. He has promised that he will be with you “to the end of the age” (Matthew 28:20) through the ministry of Word and sacraments. Thanks be to God for providing the gift of pastors to us!





THE MUST READ BOOK OF THE MONTH

LUTHER’S WORKS VOL. 26

(LECTURES ON GALATIANS CHAPTERS 1-4)

504 PAGES. HARDBACK.

Just as St. Paul's Epistle to the Galatians has been called the Magna Carta of Christian freedom, so the Lectures on Galatians delivered by Martin Luther in 1531 and published for the first time in 1535 have been hailed as the great Reformer's Magna Carta of Christian liberty. In *Grace Abounding to the Chief of Sinners* John Bunyan (1628-88), who was languishing in jail, told how a long time before this "the God, in whose hands are all days and ways, did cast into my hand, one day, a book of Martin Luther; it was his comment on the Galatians...this, methinks, I must let fall before all men, I do prefer this book of Martin Luther upon the Galatians, excepting the Holy Bible, before all books that ever I have seen, as most fit for a wounded conscience." Luther treasured St. Paul's Epistle to the Galatians. Luther's Lectures on the Galatians, like Paul's letters, contain many distinctively autobiographical statements. In more than one respect these two men of God were kindred spirits. Both inveighed sharply and vigorously against their adversaries, but they also never lost sight of the Christian love that permeates the words of those who bring God's message of salvation to their fellow men.

## THE CREED: The Third Article

### *Sanctification*

**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.**

*What does this mean?*

*I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.*

*In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.*

*In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers.*

*On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.*

*This is most certainly true.*

## Learn the Terms related to the Third Article of the Creed

**the Holy Spirit** The third person of the Holy Trinity, who proceeds from the Father and the Son to give life to the world, and who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified. His work is to proclaim Christ—to bring Him to us and to draw us into Him. He is active in the world through the preaching of the gospel and the administration of the sacraments to bring sinners to faith in Christ and to sustain them in the life of faith.

**the Gospel** The saving message of God's grace and forgiveness to sinners in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The word means "good news" and is the proclamation of what God has done in Christ for the world's salvation.

**conversion** To be brought from the death of unbelief to the life of faith in Christ.

**sanctification** All that the Holy Spirit does through the Word and sacraments of Christ to make us holy. It is the entire work of the Holy Spirit in the life of a Christian through which he is brought to faith in Christ for the forgiveness of sins, the "old man" is put to death, and the fruits of faith are brought forth in his life.

**the forgiveness of sins** That God for Christ's sake no longer holds my sins against me.

**apostles** The men who were eyewitnesses of Jesus' resurrection, chosen and "sent out" by Him to speak His Word on His behalf in the world. The Church is founded upon their word.

**prophets** The Old Testament men of God who were called by Him to preach His Word to the people of Israel and point them to the coming Savior. These men wrote the Old Testament Scriptures by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

**evangelists** Ministers in the New Testament who preached as missionaries throughout the world. The term means "Gospel preacher" and is used of the authors of the four gospels.

# Learning the Liturgy

## THE GLORIA IN EXCELSIS

*The following is from an essay on the liturgy titled, "With Angels and Archangels," by Rev. Dean M. Bell.*

Our liturgy is not a hodge-podge of unrelated parts. Rather, our worship is like a moving tapestry which simply confesses the same faith and truth from beginning to end. Its unity is constant. There is no time when God is not being worshipped. On Sunday morning we simply join the ongoing liturgy - the liturgy of "angels and archangels and all the company of heaven." On Sunday morning you become present in something which was taking place even before you were born. The constant object of our worship is "God for us" – God who comes in human flesh as our Savior. The liturgy simply places before us an ascending progression of this truth.

God, having introduced Himself anew in the Invocation now draws from His people words of praise wherein the faithful willingly confess His goodness. That this hymn should divide itself into three parts comes as no surprise. Here we simply acknowledge the epitome of God's will – the sending of His Son into the flesh for the salvation of man. As nothing stands between God's will and its fulfillment, so nothing separates the Kyrie from the Gloria in Excelsis – the latter flows from the former. The church has sung these words since at least the fourth century, another indication of the timelessness of our liturgy. Week after week it unites us with the church of every age and every place. ✠

## HELP!!! VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!

### MEALS ON WHEELS

Volunteers from College Hill Lutheran Church help deliver Meals on Wheels to shut-ins in Cedar Falls occasionally. People who have done this community service find it a very pleasant activity. The only requirement is the ability to get into and out of the back seat of a car (or van)!

You will need to be at the Community Center at 6th and Main by 10:15 am. on the day you volunteer, go in the Main entrance, past the office and turn right to the large room with tables etc. There should be 2 or 3 men with clip boards (they will be the drivers) you will be the runners. Let the drivers know that you will be the runners for that day. There are two routes, South and Central. Go with your driver to the back of the building to put coolers containing the meals in the back seat of the car or van. You will sit beside the cooler and be driven to each “stop.” The driver will tell you the name of the recipient, and you will take the meal out of the cooler and up to the house, knock on the door, and walk in announcing, “Meals on Wheels” (don’t wait for them to come to the door—just walk in.) Leave the meal and return to the car to be driven to the next stop. After all the meals have been delivered you will be returned to the Community Center.

If this is something you would like to do—or if you have any questions—Please call the church during the hours of 8:30-11:30 Tuesday-Thursday and I will put your name on the list to be called when they need volunteers.
